COMPLIANCE

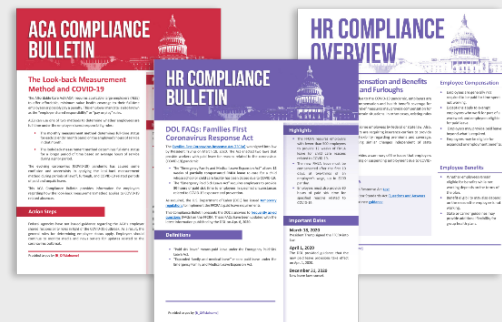

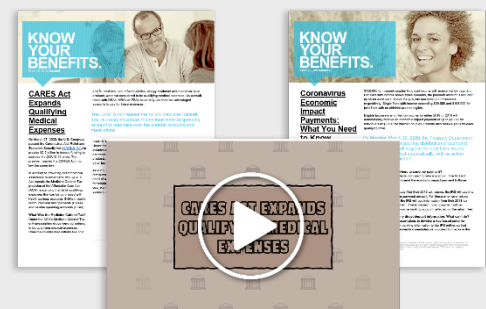
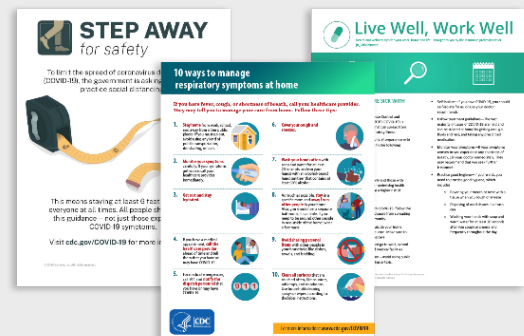
EMPLOYEE BENEFITS AND COVID-19
